## National

### Adani Group's Kutch Copper Limited Commences Phase-1 Operations in Mundra

**Kutch Copper Limited**, a subsidiary of Adani Enterprises Limited (AEL) led by Gautam Adani, commissioned the first unit of its **greenfield copper refinery** project at Mundra, Gujarat, by dispatching the maiden batch of cathodes to customers.



- This significant venture marks the Adani Group's entry into the metal industry.
- This move marks a significant step towards reducing India's reliance on copper imports and facilitating the energy transition.

**Note:** The increasing demand for copper is driven by renewable energy, electric vehicles (EVs), charging infrastructure, and the development of power transmission and distribution networks.

#### Investment and Capacity:

**i.** Adani Enterprises invested nearly USD 1.2 billion to set up a 0.5 million tonnes per annum (MTPA) copper smelter in the first phase.

### NHAI's One Vehicle, One FASTag Rules Come into Force on 1 April 2024

The National Highways Authority of India's (NHAI) 'One Vehicle, One FASTag' norm to discourage the practice of using a single FASTag for multiple vehicles or linking multiple FASTags to one vehicle has come into force from **1 April 2024**.

**Note:** Users with multiple FASTags for one vehicle are unable to utilise them all.

#### One Vehicle, One FASTag:

NHAI has introduced One Vehicle, One FASTag to streamline the electronic toll-collection process,

enhance the efficiency of the electronic toll-collection system, and alleviate congestion at toll plazas.

#### Role of FASTag in Toll Collection:

- FASTag, an electronic toll collection system operated by NHAI, utilises Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) technology.
- Over 8 crore users with a penetration rate of approximately 98% have revolutionised FASTag in India.
- It enables toll payments directly from prepaid or savings accounts linked to it or directly from the toll owner.

### Bajaj Auto, Tata Motors and Coal India among Top 5 Index Performers in FY24

Indian financial markets finished the Financial year 2023-24 (FY24) on a positive note with domestic equity indices: Nifty50 and Sensex achieving their most robust performance in three fiscal years.

- Bajaj Auto, Tata Motors and Coal India Limited emerged as the Top 3 Index Performers in FY24.

#### Top 5 Index Performers in FY24:

- Bajaj Group** emerged as the top-performing large cap on the Nifty50 in FY24. It shows an exceptional return of **142.52%** on investments made over the last 12 months. Its **market cap surged by 120%** which amounts to **Rs 2,54,000 crore** as of 1st April, 2024.
- Tata Motors** secured the **2nd spot** among top performing index in FY24. It generated a return of **136.67%** on investments over the last one year.

- Jaguar, Land Rover (wholly-owned subsidiary of Tata Motors) and expansion in sectors like: Electric Vehicle (EV), attributed growth of market cap by 139.60% in FY24.

**iii.** Indian Public Sector Unit (PSU) Coal India Limited (**CIL**) emerged as the **3rd** best-performing large cap on Nifty50 in FY24. It delivered a return of **118.73%** on investments made over the past one

year. The growth was driven by increasing power demand and increasing electrification initiatives.

iv. Adani's Group flagship port company has secured the 4th spot among top performing indexes with a return of 113.76% on investments generated over last 12 months.

### PM Modi addresses RBI@90 Programme; RBI marks 90 years

Prime Minister (PM) Narendra Modi addressed the opening ceremony of **RBI@90**, as the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) marked its 90th year on April 1, 2024. The ceremony took place at National Centre for the Performing Arts in Mumbai, Maharashtra.

i. A special **Rs 90 coin** was unveiled by Prime Minister Narendra Modi to commemorate 90 years of RBI.

ii. RBI was established on **1st April, 1935**, based on the recommendation of **Hilton Young Commission** (formed in 1926).

### Adani Green Energy Becomes India's First Company to Surpass 10,000 MW of Renewable Energy

Adani Green Energy Limited (AGEL) has become the country's first company to surpass 10,000 megawatts (MW), or 10 gigawatts (GW), of renewable energy capacity in its operational portfolio.



- AGEL has achieved this feat after it commissioned 2,000 MW of solar capacity at Khavda in Kutch, Gujarat.

#### Key Points:

- AGEL added 2,848 MW to its operational portfolio in Financial Year 2023-24 (FY24).
- AGEL's 10,934 MW operational portfolio comprises 7,393 MW of solar, 1,401 MW of wind, and 2,140 MW of wind-solar hybrid capacity.
- As per AGEL's statement, its 10,934 MW operational portfolio will power more than 5.8 million homes and avoid about 21 million tonnes of CO2 emissions annually.
- With the aim of building a 45 GW renewable energy capacity by 2030, AGEL is building a 30,000 MW solar plant, the world's largest renewable energy plant in Khavda, Gujarat.

### MEA Approves Taking Over the Operations of Sittwe Port in Myanmar

The Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) has approved a proposal for India Ports Global Limited (IPGL) to take over the operations of the Sittwe port located on the Kaladan River estuary in Rakhine, Myanmar.

- It was the second foreign port operated by India, following the Chabahar Port in Iran.
- Sittwe Port has been developed as part of the Kaladan Multi-Modal Transit Transport Project, built under Indian financial assistance.
- The Sittwe port connects to Paletwa in Myanmar through an inland waterway and from Paletwa to Zorinpui in Mizoram through a road.

**Note:** IPGL is a wholly owned subsidiary of Sagarmala Development Company Limited (SDCL) under the Ministry of Ports, Shipping, and Waterways (MoPSW).

### MoRTH Constructed 12,349 km of National Highways in FY24, the 2nd highest so far

According to the Ministry of Road Transport and Highways (MoRTH), a total of **12,349 km** of

National Highways(NHs) were constructed in the Financial Year 2023–24 (FY24). This is the **2nd** highest figure in the history of the construction of national highways.

- The Ministry also revealed that it has awarded 8,851 NH projects in FY24.
- **FY21** stands in first place with a length of **13,327km** of national highways.

#### **Pilot Program for Cashless Treatment of Road Accident Victims**

The Government of India (GoI) launched a pilot program in March 2024 to provide **cashless treatment** to the victims of road accidents due to the use of motor vehicles.

**Significance:** It aims to reduce fatalities due to road accidents by providing timely medical care including golden hour. It provides legal mandate under section 162 of Motor Vehicles Act, 1988.

#### **Key Features of the Pilot Program:**

- The program was developed by MoRTH and for initial phase, it will be introduced in Chandigarh.
- Victims entitled to get cashless treatment up to maximum of **Rs1.5 lakhs per person** for a maximum period of **7 days** from date of accident.

#### **Sam Pitroda launched a new book titled “The Idea of Democracy”**

Padma Bhushan awardee, **Satyanarayan Gangaram Pitroda**, aka **Sam Pitroda**, an Indian engineer and entrepreneur, virtually launched his new book titled **“The Idea of Democracy”**. The book was published by Penguin Business, an imprint of Penguin Random House India.

- The book shares the author’s concern about the state of democracy and the potential challenges in countries like India and the United States of America(USA).

**i.**Sam Pitroda, hailing from Odisha, served the

founding Chairman of India’s Telecom Commission and also the 1st Chairman of Worldtel Initiative of the International Telecommunication Union(1995)

**ii.**Pitroda launched the Center For The Development Of Telematics (**C-DOT**) as an autonomous telecom R&D organisation in 1984.

**iii.**He also served as Advisor to Prime Minister (PM) on Technology Missions Related to Water, Literacy, Immunization, Oil Seeds, Telecom, and Dairy

**iv.**He was honoured with **Padma Bhushan** in **2009** for Science and Engineering.

#### **105th Anniversary of Jallianwala Bagh Massacre– 13 April 2024**

**13th April 2024** marks the **105th Anniversary of the Jallianwala Bagh Massacre** (also known as

the **Amritsar Massacre**),

held on **13**

**April 1919** in

Amritsar,

Punjab, British

India (now in Punjab).



- The Day aims to honour the victims of the massacre and this tragic event also served as a pivotal moment in India’s fight for independence.

#### **About the Jallianwala Bagh Massacre:**

**i.**On 13 April 1919, on the day of Baisakhi, thousands of people gathered at the Jallianwala Bagh Garden in Amritsar for a political meeting to protest against the Rowlatt Act; and the arrest of pro-independence activists Dr. Satyapal and Dr. Saifuddin Kitchlew.

**ii.**In response, the acting Brigadier-General, Colonel Reginald Edward Harry Dyer deployed his 50 troopers, blocked the exits, and opened fire on unarmed civilians attending a peaceful gathering. It killed an estimated 379 people including men, women, and children, and injured over a thousand more.

#### **Rowlatt Act:**

i. The British colonial government passed the Rowlatt Act, officially known as the Anarchical and Revolutionary Crimes Act of 1919, based on the recommendations of the Sedition Committee, under Mr Justice Rowlatt.

- The Act was passed to suppress the increasing nationalist movement in India.

ii. It was a highly controversial piece of legislation that granted the government the power to arrest and detain Indian citizens without trial for 2 years.

#### **Formation of the Hunters Commission:**

i. On 14 October 1919, the Government of India established the Disorders Inquiry Committee, commonly known as the Hunter Commission.

- It was established after orders issued by the Secretary of State for India, Edwin Montagu.

ii. Named after its chairman, Lord William Hunter, former Solicitor-General for Scotland, the commission was tasked to investigate the Jallianwala Bagh shootings.

#### **Gopi Thotakura Named Among 6 Crew Members to fly on Blue Origin's NS-25 Mission**

Gopi Thotakura, an entrepreneur and seasoned pilot from Andhra Pradesh has been selected among 6 crew members for Blue Origin's New Shepard-25 (NS-25) space tourism mission.

#### **About the Mission:**

i. This mission will be the 7th human flight for the New Shepard program and the 25th in its history.

ii. The NS-25 mission will lift off from Blue Origin's West Texas site, United States of America (USA).

#### **Other 5 Crew members include:**

i. Mason Angel (USA); Sylvain Chiron (France); Kenneth L. Hess (USA); Carol Schaller (USA); and former USA Air Force Captain Ed Dwight.

- Ed Dwight was selected by then USA President John F. Kennedy in 1961 as America's first Black astronaut candidate.

ii. During the flight, each astronaut will carry a postcard to space on behalf of Blue Origin's foundation, Club for the Future.

#### **About Gopi Thotakura:**

i. He is now the **1st** Indian space tourist and **2nd** Indian to travel into space, following Wing Commander Rakesh Sharma of the Indian Army in 1984.

ii. He is the co-founder of Preserve Life Corp, a global center for holistic wellness and applied health located near Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport, USA.

#### **About New Shepard:**

i. New Shepard, which is named after Mercury astronaut Alan Shepard, the first American to go to space, in a reusable suborbital rocket system.

ii. It is designed to take astronauts and research payloads past the Kármán line, the internationally recognized boundary of space.

iii. Blue Origin was founded by Amazon founder Jeff Bezos.

#### **Salman Rushdie Releases New Memoir 'Knife' Recounting Stabbing**

Salman Rushdie, Indian-born British-American author, released his new memoir "**Knife: Meditations After an Attempted Murder**".

- The memoir was published by Penguin Random House, which describes how he survived the terrifying experience of being 12 times stabbed during an Arts gathering in **New York**, United States of America (USA) in August **2022**.
- The attack left the author with permanent damage, including the loss of sight in right eye.

- i. Rushdie was best known for his novel 'The Satanic Verses' which was published in 1988.
- ii. He also received the **Booker Prize** for **Midnight's Children** in 1981. The novel subsequently won the Booker of Bookers (1993) and the Best of the Booker (2008).
- iii. He has been awarded **The Peace Prize of the German Book Trade for 2023** (the most prestigious in Germany) for his indomitable spirit, for his affirmation of life and for enriching our world with his love of storytelling.

On 2nd April 2024, The World Health Organization (WHO) unveiled **S.A.R.A.H.** (Smart AI Resource Assistant for Health), its first **digital health promoter** prototype with enhanced empathetic response powered by generative artificial intelligence (AI).

**WHO launches gen-AI powered digital health promoter S.A.R.A.H. for public health**



- The digital health promoter was launched ahead of World Health Day 2024 (7th April 2024) observance focused on 'My Health, My Right'.

#### Key Points:

- i. S.A.R.A.H., also known as Sarah, is supported by Biological AI technology of Soul Machines Limited.
- ii. Sarah utilizes Gen-AI for enhanced empathetic responses and real-time accuracy, offering dynamic personalized conversations 24 hours a day in 8 languages across multiple health topics on any device.
- iii. It aims to empower users to optimize their health and well-being journey, providing nuanced, empathetic responses in a judgment-free environment.
- iv. Trained to cover major health topics, including healthy habits and mental health, S.A.R.A.H. assists users in understanding risk factors for leading causes of death worldwide, offering up-to-date information on topics such as quitting tobacco, physical activity, and healthy diet.

**Note:** Previously, WHO used a digital health worker named Florence during the COVID-19 pandemic to

disseminate critical public health messages on the virus, vaccines, tobacco use, healthy eating and physical activity.

List: The Richest in 2024' in partnership with J.P.

Morgan Bank.



**Bernard Arnault** (France), Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of LVMH Moët Hennessy Louis Vuitton (LVMH) topped the list with a net worth of USD 233 Billion.

- He is followed by **Elon Musk**, CEO of Tesla Motors with a net worth of USD 195 Billion and **Jeff Bezos**, founder & Former CEO of Amazon with USD 194 Billion at 3rd place.

**Mukesh Ambani**, Chairman And Managing Director (CMD) of Reliance Industries Limited (RIL), ranked **9th globally** with a net worth of USD 116 Billion, becomes the **richest man in India**. He is the **only Indian** to feature among the **top 10**.

- He also became the **first Asian** to break into the USD 100 billion club.
- Gautam Adani became the 2nd richest Indian with a net worth of USD 84 billion followed by Shiv Nadar as 3rd richest with a net worth of USD 36.9 billion.

#### Romania & Bulgaria Partially Join Europe's Schengen Travel Zone

As of 31st

March 2024, **Romania** and **Bulgaria** became the newest **Member States** to partially join the **Schengen area**, the Europe's ID-check-free travel zone. With this any person crossing the internal air and sea borders will no longer be subject to checks.

- With this, the Schengen area now has **29 members**.

#### Background:

**i.** Bulgaria and Romania have successfully accomplished the Schengen evaluation process set out in their **Treaties of Accession**, taking all the necessary measures to ensure application of all relevant parts of the **Schengen acquis**.

**ii.** In 2011, the European Commission (EC) confirmed that Romania and Bulgaria have met the technical criteria for full accession.

**iii.** In 2022, Austria vetoed the full accession of Romania and Bulgaria to Schengen, but allowed Croatia full accession. Croatia joined as a 27th Schengen member in January 2023.

#### Schengen Area:

**i.** The Schengen Area is a free travel area that includes most of the European Union (EU) members (27 European countries) except Ireland and Cyprus, and the European Free Trade Association (EFTA) member states of Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway, and Switzerland.

**ii.** The Schengen Area was created by the **Schengen**

**Agreement**, a treaty signed by Belgium, Germany, France, Luxembourg and the Netherlands, the member states of the European Economic Community (EC) in the town of Schengen, Luxembourg on **June 14, 1985**.

### Singapore, Denmark and U.S. are the Best Places in the world to Conduct Business: EIU' BER 2024

The **Economist Intelligence Unit (EIU)** released its Business Environment Rankings (BER) 2024, assessing 82 countries across 91 crucial indicators across 11 categories to determine the best places for conducting business.

- Singapore retains its top position for the **16th consecutive year**, followed by Denmark and the United States (US) at 2nd and 3rd place respectively in the world to conduct business.
- India ranked 51 in the list with a score of 1.08.

#### Assessment:

The report ranked the improvement in the business environment for the period from 2019-2023 to 2024-28.

#### Big Improvers:

**i. Greece, Qatar, and India** have made significant strides in providing favorable business environments globally.

- **India ranks third** among the most improved business environments globally, projecting strong economic growth and heightened foreign investment.

**ii. Vietnam, Thailand, Belgium, Sweden, India, and Costa Rica** are notable improvers.

#### Biggest Deterioration:

**i. China, Bahrain, Chile, and Slovakia** have experienced notable declines in their business environments.

**ii. China's** substantial drop by 11 spots marks it as the biggest loser globally, reflecting challenges in its business landscape compared to the previous year.

### India ranks 3rd in Hurun's Global Unicorn Index 2024

According to the **6th edition** of "Global Unicorn Index 2024" report published by Hurun Institute, India is ranked at 3rd position in the index with 67 unicorns (down to 1 compared to 2023).

**i. While**, Indian Ed-tech giant Byju's and PharmEasy were dropped out from the index.

**ii. United States of America (U.S.A.)** continued to be at top position with 703 unicorns which accounted for **48%** of world total number of unicorns.

**iii. India** was ranked 3rd with 67 unicorns led by on-demand food delivery start-up **Swiggy (USD8 billion)** followed by **Dream11 (USD8 billion)** and **Razorpay (USD7.5 billion)**.

#### About Global Unicorn Index:

**i. It** is compiled by Hurun Research Institute and includes companies founded in the 2000s with a



current valuation of USD1 billion, not yet list on public exchange.

ii. The data is for January 2023 to January 2024, compared with January 2022 to January 2023.

iii. Hurun Research has been tracking unicorns since 2017.

### **Zimbabwe Launches New Gold-Backed Currency “ZiG”; Replaces Zimbabwe dollars**

The Reserve Bank of Zimbabwe (RBZ) has launched the new currency “Zimbabwe Gold (ZiG)” backed by gold and foreign currencies to replace its local currency Zimbabwe dollars (ZWS)– Real Time Gross Settlement (RTGS) dollar.

#### **Key Points:**

i. RBZ has notified that the banks should convert the current Zimbabwe dollar balances into the ZiG with effect from **5th April 2024**.

ii. The ZiG notes and coins will start circulating in the economy on **30th April 2024**.

iii. The banks will continue to accept ZW\$ deposits for a period of 21 days after 5 April 2024.

#### **About Zimbabwe Gold:**

i. ZiG is backed by a composite basket of foreign currency and precious metals, mainly gold.

ii. The initial exchange rate of ZiG is set at 13.56 ZiG per US dollar (USD).

iii. The new ZiG notes and coins will be issued in the denomination of 1ZiG, 2ZiG, 5ZiG, 10ZiG, 20ZiG, 50ZiG, 100ZiG, and 200ZiG.

### **WHO Global Hepatitis Report 2024; Hepatitis is 2nd Leading Infectious cause of Death Globally**

i. On April 9, 2024, the World Health Organisation (WHO) in its ‘Global Hepatitis Report 2024 -Action for access in low- and middle-income countries’ during the World Hepatitis Summit (WHS) 2024, organized by World Hepatitis Alliance with the support of the Ministry of Health of Portugal,

in **Lisbon**, from April 9–11, 2024, on the theme ‘**Integrate, Accelerate, Eliminate**’.

ii. As per it, there is alarming increase in deaths caused by viral hepatitis, making it the second leading infectious cause of death globally, after **Tuberculosis (TB)**.

iii. This is the **first consolidated WHO report** on viral hepatitis epidemiology, service coverage and product access, with improved data for action.

iv. Viral hepatitis claims 1.3 million lives annually, with 83% attributed to hepatitis B and 17% to hepatitis C.

v. It was developed by the **WHO Department of Global HIV, Hepatitis and Sexually Transmitted Infection (STI) Programmes** (HHS) jointly with the Department of Health Product Policy and Standards (HPS), Department of Immunization, Vaccines and Biologicals and Department of Regulation and Prequalification.

### **QS World University Rankings by Subject 2024: JNU ranked as India’s Top University for Development Studies**

i. On April 10, 2024, the Quacquarelli Symonds (QS) released the **14th edition** of QS World University Rankings by Subject 2024 which marked Jawaharlal Nehru University (JNU), New Delhi, Delhi as India’s highest-ranked in Development Studies (20th globally).

ii. Music is the one new subject to be added to 2024 rankings.

iii. The edition featured 55 individual subjects across five broad subject areas viz. Arts & Humanities, Engineering & Technology, Life Sciences & Medicine, Natural Sciences and Social Sciences & Management.

iv. **Harvard University** of United States (US) topped the 4 broad subjects.

v. 69 Indian universities featured in the 2024 QS World

University Rankings by Subject, with 424 entries, marking a **19.4%** increase from 2023.

**Israel Deploys C-Dome Defence System for First time**

Israel has deployed its ship-mounted defence system ‘C-Dome’ for the first time in Eilat, the southernmost city of Israel.

- The C-Dome is a naval version of the Iron Dome air defence system used to shield against rocket and missile attacks.
- On 8th April 2024, the Israel Defence Forces (IDF) successfully intercepted the suspicious aerial target crossing into Israeli territory using the C-Dome defence system.

Note: The C-Dome Defence System was developed by the state-owned defence company Rafael Advanced Defence Systems.

**Delhi airport Ranked 10th among World’s Top 10 Busiest Airports in 2023: ACI**

i.The Airports Council International (ACI) World released its report on the ‘Top 10 Busiest Airports Worldwide for 2023’ with **Delhi Airport** (Indira Gandhi International Airport – IGIA) securing the 10th spot in 2023.

ii.Handling over **7.22 crore passengers** in 2023, IGIA experienced a slight drop from its 9th position in 2022, with Chicago O’Hare Airport surpassing it.

iii.Despite this, the airport exhibited a steady Year-on-Year (Y-o-Y) growth of 20.36% from 2022, showcasing the robust recovery of the Indian aviation sector.

iv.It was ranked 9th in 2022, 13th in 2021, and as the 17th busiest airport in 2019, before the coronavirus pandemic.

v.**Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport (ATL), United States (US)** regains title as world’s

busiest with 104.65 million passengers in 2023, yet remains 5% below 2019 levels due to pandemic recovery.

**Skytrax World Airport Awards 2024: Hamad International Airport of Doha (Qatar) Named World’s Best Airport**

Stockholm International Peace Research Institute (SIPRI) released its report titled 'Trends in World Military Expenditure, 2023'. According to the report, the total global military expenditure increased for the 9th consecutive year to an all-time high of USD 2443 billion in 2023, an increase of 6.8% in real terms from 2022. This is the steepest year-on-year increase since 2009.

**i.** The top 5 military spenders in 2023 are the United States of America (USA) (1st), China (2nd), Russia (3rd), **India** (4th) and Saudi Arabia (5th), which together accounted for 61% of world military spending.

**ii.** With a military expenditure of USD 83.6 billion in 2023, India was the 4th largest spender globally. India's military spending has increased by 4.2% from 2022 and 44% from 2014.

**iii.** In 2023, **North Atlantic Treaty Organization** (NATO) members, including the USA, collectively spent USD 1341 billion. This accounts for around 55% of global military spending.

- i.**Gagan Shakti involves all air force bases and assets nationwide.
- ii.**Fighter planes and helicopters will engage pseudo targets at Pokhran Field Firing Ranges.
- iii.**It is the biggest IAF war exercise since ‘Vayu Shakti’.
- iv.**The exercise evaluates the IAF’s readiness for intense operations.

The Indian Army is providing logistical support, including passenger trains named **Sanyukta Express**.

- It has facilitated a comprehensive pan-India movement of approximately 10,000 IAF personnel and ammunition in order to validate the Operational Rail Mobilisation Plan (ORMP) aspects of the IAF

v. Over 11,000 sorties were completed during the previous 'Gagan Shakti' in 2018.

### SFC & DRDO Successfully Flight-Tests New Generation Ballistic Missile "Agni-Prime"

On 3rd April 2024, Strategic Forces Command (SFC) and Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) successfully conducted the flight test of the New Generation Ballistic missile Agni-Prime (Agni-P) from Dr. APJ

**Agni-Prime, India's New Generation Ballistic Missile, Flight-Tested Successfully**



Abdul Kalam Island off the coast of Odisha.

- The flight test achieved all the trial objectives validating its reliable performance.

#### About Agni-Prime (Agni-P):

- It is a two-stage surface-to-surface, canisterised solid propellant ballistic missile.
  - It is equipped with dual redundant navigation and guidance system.
  - It has a range between **1000km to 2000km**.
  - It is the **6th** variant of Agni series missiles developed under Integrated Guided Missile Development Program (**IGMDP**).
- Note:** Other 5 missiles developed under IGMDP: Prithvi, Trishul, Nag, Agni, and Akash.
- v. The Agni-Prime missile is 10.5 metre (m) tall with diameter of 1.2 metre and can carry warheads up to 1.5 tonnes.

#### Additional Information:

In March 2024, DRDO successfully conducted flight test of **Agni-5** missile with **MIRV** (Multiple Independently-targetable Reentry Vehicle) technology under mission **Divyastra**.

'**Bandwagon-1**', the first rideshare mission to low-Earth orbit at inclinations of about 45 degrees with a **Falcon 9** rocket from National Aeronautics and Space Administration (**NASA**) Kennedy Space Center, **Florida**, United States of America(**USA**).

#### **Key Points**

- Bandwagon-1 carries **11 satellites**, including KOREA's 425Sat, HawkEye 360's Clusters 8 & 9, Tyvak International's CENTAURI-6, iQPS's QPS-Synthetic Aperture Radar (SAR)-7 TSUKUYOMI-II, Capella Space's Capella-14 and Tata Advanced Systems Limited's TSAT-1A.
- A '**425 Project**' satellite for the military of **South Korea** was probably the largest of the 11 satellites carried by Bandwagon-1.

**Note:** The first 425 Project satellite, the one optical/infrared spacecraft was launched with Falcon 9 rocket in December 2023.

#### **About Falcon 9 rocket**

- It is the **World's First Orbital-class reusable rocket**, designed and manufactured by SpaceX which helps in

safe transport and reduction of costs for space programs.

**Note:** India has listed the building of reusable rockets as one of its targets of Decade (2021-30).

### India gets 24 Igla-S Anti-Aircraft Missiles from Russia

The Indian Army has acquired the first batch of 24 Russia-made Igla-S Man Portable Air Defence Systems (MANPADS)



along with 100 missiles, as part of an agreement involving domestic production in India.

- This will bolster the Indian Army's Very Short Range Air Defence (VSHORAD) capabilities.

#### About Igla-S:

- It is a hand-held defence system designed to bring down low-flying aircraft, identify and neutralise air targets such as cruise missiles and drones.
- The system comprising the 9M342 missile, 9P522 launching mechanism, 9V866-2 mobile test station, and 9F719-2 test set, it offers comprehensive air defence capabilities.
- Igla-S include a firing range of 500-6000 m, target altitude from 10-3500m, and capability to engage various types of targets.
- Its Target speed is- head-on: up to 400 m/s, and pursuit: up to 400 m/s.

### Exercise "DUSTLIK 2024": India-Uzbekistan Joint Military Exercise To Strengthen Bilateral Relations

The 5th edition of the India-Uzbekistan Joint Military Exercise 'DUSTLIK 2024', is being conducted from



15th to 28th April 2024 in Termez District, the Republic of Uzbekistan.

#### Note:

- Exercise DUSTLIK 2023, 4th edition of the exercise between India and Uzbekistan was held from 20th February to 5th March 2023 at the Foreign Training Node, Pithoragarh in Uttarakhand (India).
- The first edition of Exercise DUSTLIK was held in Uzbekistan in November 2019.

#### Exercise DUSTLIK 2024:

##### Participants:

- The Indian Armed Forces contingent of 60 personnel is being represented by **45 personnel** from the Indian Army (IA), majorly from a Battalion of the JAT Regiment, and **15 personnel** from the Indian Air Force (IAF).
- The Uzbekistan contingent comprising approximately 100 personnel, from the Uzbekistan Army and Air Force, will be represented by personnel from Southern Operational Command, part of South-West Military District.

##### Objective:

- To improve combined capabilities and promote military cooperation in order to carry out joint operations in semi-urban and hilly terrain.
- The exercise will focus on high degree of physical fitness, joint planning, joint tactical drills and basics of special arms skills.

### Abdel Fattah Al-Sisi sworn in as Egypt's President for the 3rd Term

Abdel Fattah Al-Sisi has taken oath as the President of Egypt for the third term in the New Administrative Capital of the country. The 69-



year-old former army chief will continue with his presidential powers **until 2030** that followed constitutional amendments that extended presidential terms to six years allowing him to stand for a third election.

- He has won the election in December 2023 with 89.6% of the votes and with no major challengers.

**Note:** The \$58 billion **New Administrative Capital** is located in the desert east of Cairo and is the largest of the mega projects, which also include an expansion of the Suez Canal, extensive road building, and other new cities.

#### Key Points:

- The presidency of Al-Sisi first came into power after the country's first popularly elected president, Mohamed Morsi was overthrown in 2013. He was then re-elected in 2018 with 97 percent votes in both the previous elections.
- He extended the presidential tenure from four to six years and revised the constitution to increase the cap on consecutive terms in office from two to three.

#### About Abdel Fattah Al-Sisi

i.Sisi graduated from the Egyptian Military Academy in 1977 and then he served in the infantry. In 2010 he was appointed to the post of director of military

intelligence.

ii.Sisi became the youngest member of the Supreme Council of the Armed Forces (SCAF) in 2011, a body of senior military officers that took over the governing of Egypt.

iii.He was then promoted to the positions of defense minister and commander of the armed forces in August 2012.

The Ministry of Law and Justice (**MoL&J**) has constituted a **6-member committee** to examine various issues relating to the queer (LGBTQIA+ – Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Intersex, Queer/Questioning, and Asexual) community. The Committee is headed by the Cabinet Secretary, **Rajiv Gauba**.

#### **Background:**

In October 2023, the Supreme Court of India directed the formation of a six-member committee to examine issues related to the queer community in the case of *Supriyo v Union of India*.

- This will also retain the flexibility to address pertinent issues as deemed necessary

#### **Additional info:**

- The 5-judge Constitution Bench of the Supreme Court led by Chief Justice of India (CJI) D Y Chandrachud refused legal recognition for same-sex marriages, deferring to Parliament for decision-making.
- The Court refused to strike down the Special Marriage Act 1954 for not allowing registration of same-sex marriages.
- The court also emphasised the need to protect LGBTQIA+ couples from harassment.

- This is his 1st trophy at the **hard-court** event and his 2nd ATP Masters 1000 title overall.

**i.**The 2024 Miami Open(Aka Miami Masters 2024), presented by Itaú, was held from 17th to 31st March 2024 at Hard Rock Stadium, Miami, Florida, USA.

**ii.**Miami Open 2024 is the **39th edition** of the combined men's and women's tournament.

**iii.**The Miami Open is classified as an ATP Masters 1000 event on the 2024 ATP tour and a Women's Tennis Association(WTA) 1000 event on the 2024 WTA tour.

#### Points to note:

**i.**This marks his 3rd title of 2024 after the Australian Open 2024 (January 2024) and Rotterdam Open 2024 (February 2024).

**ii.**He has won a total of 13 ATP singles titles,

including a Grand Slam title at the 2024 Australian Open.

iii. At present, Jannik Sinner is **ranked 2nd** in the Men's Tennis ATP ranking 2024.

iv. Previously, he finished runner-up at the Miami Open 2021 and 2023.

#### Women's Singles:

**Daniel Collins** of the USA won the **Miami Open 2024 Women's singles title** by defeating World No. 4 Elena Rybakina of Kazakhstan. This marks her first career WTA 1000 title and 3rd WTA Tour Singles title.

- In January 2024, Collins announced that she would retire at the end of the 2024 season.

#### India's Bopanna & Australia's Ebden won Men's Doubles Title:

India's Rohan Bopanna and Australia's Matthew Ebden won the 2024 Miami Open **men's doubles title** defeating Croatia's Ivan Dodig and USA's Austin Krajicek.

- This marks the pair's 2nd title in 2024 after winning the 2024 Australian Open.
- Currently, Bopanna & Ebden are ranked 1st and 2nd in the ATP Men's doubles ranking.

i. Bopanna (44 years old) surpassed his record & became the oldest ATP Masters 1000 champion.

ii. At the age of 43 he became the oldest ATP Masters 1000 champion by winning the Indian Wells title in 2023.

#### Women's Doubles:

USA's Sofia Kennin and Bethanie Mattek-Sands won the women's doubles title by defeating Canada's Gabriela Dabrowski and New Zealand's Erin Routliffe in the Women's Doubles finals.

- This marks Bethanie's 30th WTA Doubles title and Sofia's 4th WTA title.
- This is also the duo's 2nd win in the 2024 season, after Mubadala Abu Dhabi Open 2024, and the 3rd as a team, after Beijing 2019.

#### Mirabai Chanu Becomes the Only Indian Weightlifter to Qualify for Paris Olympics

Saikhom Mirabai Chanu became the only Indian weightlifter to qualify for the Paris Olympics 2024 after finishing third in Group B of the women's 49kg division and 12th overall with a total lift of 184kg (81kg snatch + 103kg clean and jerk) at the International Weightlifting Federation (IWF) World Cup 2024.

- The 2024 IWF World Cup is being held from 31st March to 11th April 2024 in Phuket, Thailand.
- The 2024 IWF World Cup is one of the two compulsory competitions to qualify for the Paris Olympics, another is the IWF World Weightlifting Championships 2023 that was held in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia from 4th to 17th September 2023.

#### Key Points:

- She has fulfilled the criteria for the Paris Olympics, which includes participating in two mandatory events and three other qualifiers.
  - Mirabai is ranked second in the IWF women's 49kg Olympic Qualification Ranking (OQR). Only the top 10 players from each weight class in OQR will qualify for the Paris Olympics.
- About Mirabai Chanu:**
- Mirabai Chanu won the silver medal in the 2020 Tokyo(Japan) Olympics in the women's 49kg category.
    - She was the second Indian weightlifter after Karnam Malleswari to win an Olympic medal.
  - She was awarded the **Padma Sri** in 2018 in the field of sports.
  - She was also honoured with the Major Dhyan Chand Khel Ratna Award in 2018.
- Note:**The 2024 Paris Olympics is set to be the third Olympic games for Mirabai Chanu after she participated in Rio 2016(Brazil) and Tokyo 2020(Japan).

**ii.** He was also the second person to win three consecutive Japanese GP titles after Germany's Michael Schumacher (retired with Ferrari), who won them in 2000, 2001, and 2002.

**iii.** The Japanese GP 2024 title marks Verstappen's third title of the 2024 season. He previously won the Saudi Arabian GP 2024 and the Bahrain GP 2024.

### Badminton: India's Anupama and Tharun Win Singles Titles at Kazakhstan International Challenge 2024

India's Anupama Upadhyaya and Tharun Mannepalli won the women's and men's singles titles, respectively, at the Kazakhstan International Challenge 2024 Badminton tournament in Uralsk, Kazakhstan, from 2nd to 6th April 2024.

#### Indian Winners:

**i.** Tharun Mannepalli of Telangana defeated Soong Joo Ven (Malaysia) in the men's singles final.

- It marks Tharun's first title on the senior circuit.
- He was the runner-up in the Badminton national championship in 2023.

**ii.** Former Junior World No. 1 Anupama Upadhyaya (Uttarakhand) defeated Isharani Baruah in the all-Indian women's singles finals.

- It marks her second international title in 2024 after winning the Polish Open (Poland).
- She has previously won the India International Challenge 2021, the Tajikistan International Series 2023, and the Polish Open (2022 and 2024).

**iii.** The Indian pair Sanjai Srivatsa Dhanraj and Maneesha K clinched second place in the mixed doubles after they lost to Malaysia's Wong Tien Ci and Lim Chiew Sien.

### About Kazakhstan International Challenge:

**i.** The Kazakhstan International Challenge 2024 (officially known as Condensate Kazakhstan International Challenge) is the Continental Level (Grade 3) event of the Badminton World Federation (BWF).

**ii.** It was organised by the Kazakhstan National Badminton Federation with sanction from the BWF.

**Note:** BWF major events come under Grade 1 while BWF world tour events come under Grade 2.

### Former Tennis World No. 1 Garbine Muguruza of Spain Announces Retirement

Spanish women's tennis player **Garbiñe** Muguruza Blanco, a **2-time** Grand Slam champion in singles and former **world No. 1** (in 2017), has announced her retirement from professional tennis at the age of 30.

- She became the 1st Spanish woman to win a Grand Slam singles title since Arantxa Sánchez Vicario (Spain) won the 1989 French Open in Paris.

#### Notable Victories:

**i.** Defeated Serena Williams (United States of America (USA)) at the 2016 French Open held in Paris, France;

**ii.** Defeated Venus Williams (USA) at the 2017 Wimbledon held in London, United Kingdom (UK).

- She remains the only player to beat both Venus and Serena in the finals to win a major title.

**iii.** 3 Women's Tennis Association (WTA) 1000 titles (2015 Beijing (China), 2017 Cincinnati (USA), 2021 Dubai (United Arab Emirates (UAE)));

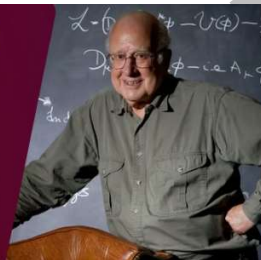
**iv.** She also won the 2021 WTA Finals by defeating Anett Kontaveit (Estonia) held in Guadalajara, Mexico.

#### Awards/Honours:

**i.** In 2015, he won the world's oldest scientific prize, the Royal Society's **Copley Medal** for his work on the theory of the Higgs boson or "The god particle".

**ii.** In 2013, he was jointly awarded the **Nobel Prize in Physics** with Belgian Physicist François Englert.

- The award was "for the theoretical discovery of a mechanism that contributes to our understanding of the origin of the mass of subatomic particles".

**iii.** In recognition of his contributions to science, he was appointed as Companion of Honour in the 2013 New Year Honours List.

**iv.** In 2013, he received the **Edinburgh Medal** of the Edinburgh International Science Festival (with

European Organization for Nuclear Research (CERN)); and the **Nonino 'Man of Our Time' Prize**.

**vi.** In 2004, he was jointly awarded the **Wolf Prize in Physics** with Robert Brout and François Englert.

**vii.** In 1997, he was jointly awarded the **High Energy and Particle Physics Prize** from the European Physical Society with Robert Brout and François Englert.

#### About Peter Higgs:

**i.** Higgs began his teaching career as a Temporary Lecturer in Mathematics at University College London, UK.

**ii.** He returned to Edinburgh in 1960, joining the Tait Institute as a Lecturer in Mathematical Physics.

**iii.** Over the years, he advanced through the ranks, eventually attaining a Personal Chair of Theoretical Physics in 1980.

**iv.** He retired in 1996, becoming Professor Emeritus at the University of Edinburgh.

The United Nations (UN) **World Autism Awareness Day** (WAAD) is annually observed across the globe on **2 April** to raise awareness about Autism spectrum disorder (ASD)



and promote the realisation of human rights and basic freedoms for autistic individuals on an equal basis with others.

- **2 April 2024** marks the observance of the **17th** annual World Autism Awareness Day.
- The **2024 theme** of WAAD is, “**Empowering Autistic Voices**”
- WAAD 2024 event was organised by the United Nations Department of Global Communications (**DGC**), in collaboration with the Switzerland-based Institute of Neurodiversity (ION).

#### Background:

i. On 18 December 2007, the UN General Assembly (UNGA) adopted the resolution A/RES/62/139 and proclaimed the 2 April of every year as World Autism

Awareness Day.

ii. The **first-ever** World Autism Awareness Day was observed on **2 April 2008**.

### 61st National Maritime Day – April 5 2024

National Maritime Day (NMD) is annually observed across India on **5 April** to highlight the significance of the national maritime sector in the development of the Indian economy, global trade, and economic exchange across countries.



- The day also commemorates the maiden voyage of SS Loyalty, India’s first Swadeshi Ship (owned by Scindia Steam Navigation Company) from Mumbai (Maharashtra) to London (United Kingdom) on 5th April 1919.

**5 April 2024** marks the observance of the **61st** National Maritime Day.

- **Merchant Navy Week 2024** (National Maritime Week) is celebrated alongside National Maritime Day 2024 from 30th March 2024 to 5th April 2024.

**Theme:** The **theme** of National Maritime Day/Merchant Navy Week 2024 is “**Sustainable Shipping: Challenges and Opportunities.**”

#### Background:

i. National Maritime Day was initiated by the Ministry of Ports, Shipping, and Waterways (MoPSW), Government of India

ii. The **1st ever** National Maritime Day was observed on **5 April 1964**.

### World Health Day 2024 – April 7

The United Nations (UN) **World Health**



**Day** is a global health awareness day annually observed across the globe on **7 April** to draw attention to a specific health topic of concern to people worldwide.

- The World Health Day celebration has aimed to create awareness of a specific health theme to highlight a priority area of concern for the World Health Organization (WHO).
- **7 April 2024** marks the **76th anniversary** of the **founding** of **WHO** in 1948.

**i.** The **theme** for World Health Day 2024 is **‘My health, my right’**.

**ii.** NMC & NTF Launches “My Health, My Rights” Initiative for Medical Students and Professionals.

### World Homeopathy Day 2024 – April 10

World Homeopathy Day (WHD) is annually observed across the globe on **10 April** to raise awareness about homeopathy, a therapeutic system of Medicine, its principles, and its contributions to global healthcare.



- WHD also commemorates the **birth anniversary** of **Dr Christian Friedrich Samuel Hahnemann**, a German physician and chemist, who is regarded as the founder of homeopathy.
- **10th April 2024** marks the **269th** birth anniversary of Dr Christian Friedrich Samuel Hahnemann.
- The **theme** for World Homeopathy Day 2024 is **“Homeoparivar: One Health, One Family.”**

### 40th Siachen Day – 13 April 2024

**Siachen Day** is annually observed by the Indian Army on **13 April** to commemorate **Operation Meghdoot** launched by the Indian Army on 13 April 1984.

- The Day honours the bravery and sacrifice of the Indian Army soldiers serving at the highest and coldest battlefield in the world, the **Siachen Glacier**, a part of the Union Territory (UT) Ladakh, located in the eastern Karakoram range in the Himalayas.

**13th April 2024** marks the **40th year** of Indian Army’s presence at Siachen Glacier.

#### Operation Meghdoot:

**i.** Operation Meghdoot was an Indian military operation launched to secure control of the entire Siachen Glacier in Jammu and Kashmir (J&K) (now in the northern Ladakh region).

**ii.** It marked the first assault on the world’s highest battlefield, resulting in Indian troops gaining control of the entire Siachen Glacier.

**iii.** The escalation of Pakistan’s activities in Ladakh prompted India to take action to safeguard its interests.

**iv.** The Indian Air Force (IAF) played a pivotal role in this operation.

- The operation involved airlifting Indian Army soldiers, with IAF helicopters operating in the area.

#### Points to note:

**i.** Both India and Pakistan maintain a permanent military presence in the region at a height of over 6,000 meters (20,000 feet).



ii. IAF helicopters has been operating in the Siachen Glacier since 1978, flying the Chetak helicopters, the 1st IAF helicopter to land in the Glacier in October 1978.

### International Day For Monuments and Sites 2024 – April 18

International Day For Monuments and Sites (IDMS) also known as World Heritage Day is annually observed across the globe on **18 April** to encourage local communities and individuals across the world to recognise the significance of cultural heritage in their lives, identities, and communities. The **theme** for International Day for Monuments and Sites 2024 is “**Disasters & Conflicts Through the Lens of the Venice Charter.**”

#### Background:

i. The International Day for Monuments and Sites (IDMS) was first established in 1982 by the International Council of Monuments and Sites (ICOMOS).

ii. ICOMOS’ establishment of IDMS was approved by the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation (UNESCO) at its 22nd General Conference in 1983.

iii. IDMS was first observed in 1983 by UNESCO.

#### About International Council on Monuments and Sites (ICOMOS):

ICOMOS, a non-governmental organisation, was founded in 1965 after the adoption of the Charter of Venice.

- **21 April 2024** marks the observance of the **17th National Civil Services Day.**

#### Background:

i. In 2006, India’s then Prime Minister (PM), Dr. Manmohan Singh inaugurated an event to mark the ‘Civil Service Day.’

- All 61 All India and Central Civil Services, including 15 non-technical and 20 technical services, were collectively observing the day.

ii. The **1st National Civil Services Day** celebrations were held in Vigyan Bhawan, New Delhi (Delhi) on **21 April 2006.**

### International Mother Earth Day 2024 – April 22

The United Nations (UN) **International Mother Earth Day (or Earth Day)** is annually observed across the globe on **22nd April** to recognise the relationship between humans and nature in the ecosystems.

- The day highlights the need to protect and enhance people’s livelihoods, counteract climate change, and stop the collapse of biodiversity.

According to Earthday.org, the **theme** of Earth Day 2024 is **Planet vs. Plastics.**

#### Background:

i. The United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) adopted the resolution A/RES/63/278 on 22nd April 2009 and proclaimed the 22nd April of every year as International Mother Earth Day.

- This proposal was initiated by the ‘Plurinational State of Bolivia’.

ii. The first-ever International Mother Earth Day was observed on 22nd April 2009.

### World Book And Copyright Day 2024 – April 23

World Book And Copyright Day is annually observed across the globe on **23 April** to promote the love of reading and the significance of books.

- The Day serves as a reminder of the importance of literature in connecting the past, present, and future generations across diverse cultures.
- The annual observance of the Day is led by the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (**UNESCO**).

According to the various news sites, the theme of World Book and Copyright Day 2024 is “**Read Your Way**”.

#### Background:

i. UNESCO during the 28th session of its General Conference held in Paris, France from 25 October to 16 November 1995, unanimously declared 23 April to be World Book and Copyright Day.

#### Why April 23rd?

i. April 23rd marks the death anniversary of renowned authors such as English Poet **William**

**Shakespeare**, Spanish writer Miguel de Cervantes, and Peru-born Spanish Inca Garcilaso de la Vega.

ii. UNESCO chose the date to honour the contributions of these literary figures and promote global access to books.

#### World Book Capital:

Following the evaluation of the World Book Capital (**WBC**) Advisory Committee, the Director-General of UNESCO, Audrey Azoulay has designated **Strasbourg (France)** as the **World Book Capital for 2024**.

### 15th National Panchayati Raj Day – April

**24, 2024** National Panchayati Raj Day (NPRD), (also known as National Local Self-Government Day) is annually observed across India on **24 April** to recognise and honour the establishment of the

Panchayati Raj System and its pivotal role in decentralised governance at the grassroots.

- **24 April 2024** marks the observance of the **15th** National Panchayati Raj Day.

The observance of NPRD is led by the Ministry of Panchayati Raj (MoPR).

#### Background:

i. In consultation with the States, the Government of India (GoI) has decided to celebrate 24th April as National Panchayati Raj Day (NPRD).

ii. In 2010, then Prime Minister of India Manmohan Singh declared the 24th April of every year as National Panchayati Raj Day.

iii. The first ever NPRD was observed on 24th April 2010.

#### Why April 24?

i. The day commemorates the institutionalisation of the Panchayati Raj in India through the Constitution (73rd Amendment) Act, 1992, which came into force on 24 April 1993.

### World Intellectual Property Day 2024 – April 26

World Intellectual Property Day (World IP Day) is annually observed across the globe on **26**

**April** to raise awareness and understanding of intellectual

property (IP) and the significance of IP in

fostering innovation and creativity globally.

The day also marks the anniversary of the establishment of World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO).

- The **theme of World IP Day 2024** is, “**IP and the SDGs: building our common future with innovation and creativity**”.

#### Background:

i. In 2000, WIPO’s member states designated April 26



of every year as World IP Day, to increase general awareness and understanding of IP.

ii. The 1st ever World IP Day was observed on 26 April 2001.

#### Why April 26?

i. 26 April marks the day on which the WIPO Convention came into force in 1970.

#### About World Intellectual Property Organisation (WIPO):

**Headquarters**– Geneva, Switzerland.

#### International Dance Day 2024 – April 29

International Dance Day or World Dance Day is annually observed across the globe on 29 April to celebrate the art of dance, and its universal appeal, transcending political, cultural, and ethnic boundaries, and uniting people through the universal language of dance.

- The Day also commemorates the **birth anniversary** of the French dancer, and ballet master **Jean-Georges Noverre** (1727-1810). He is considered the inventor of ballet d'action or dramatic ballet.

The annual observance of World Dance Day is led by the International Theatre Institute (ITI), the world's largest organisation for the performing arts.

#### Background:

In 1982, the International Dance Committee (IDC) of ITI established International Dance Day to be celebrated every year on 29 April, the birth anniversary of Jean-Georges Noverre.

- The Dance Committee of ITI is the main partner for the performing arts of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO).

**Note:** Jean-Georges Noverre is also known as “the Grandfather of the Ballet” and “the pioneer of modern ballet”.
